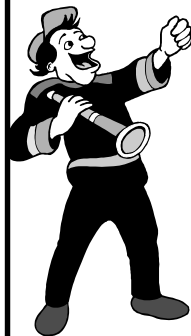

Convention Center Hours

The Convention Center will be open to the public from 8 a.m. until midnight Monday through Saturday. Sunday, the hours will be 8 a.m. until 7 p.m. On nights we have Midnight Games, the players may stay in to play, but the doors will be locked after midnight.

Entry Fees

The entry fee is \$10 per player per session for all events. The entry fee for Late Night Zip KO's is \$10 per team per match.

Youth and Novice Discounts:

The MABC offers a \$5.00 discount on each full session at each Regional for contestants ages 21 and under, or full-time students 22-25. Pairs of players with 0-20 Masterpoints each who are playing in the Intermediate/Novice pair game also receive a discount of \$5.00 per player. Inform the director when purchasing the entry.

Electronic Equipment

Except for health related equipment or by permission of the Director-In-Charge of the tournament or event, cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play. If you are expecting an emergency call, you may leave your phone in the tournament office.

Food Court

The food court is located between Great Halls 2 & 3. It will offer drinks, snacks, etc. Beginning Wednesday, the chits you receive maybe used along with additional monies to purchase snacks. **Chits may not be redeemed for cash.**

Wheelchairs

A limited number of wheelchairs are available to players for use in the Convention Center. Please come to Room 12 for this service.

Handicap Entrances

There are two handicap entrances to the Convention Center, Parkway and Airport Road. On the Parkway to the left of the stairs is a sidewalk with a very small sign, **Handicap Entrance**. This sidewalk leads to the entrance of the elevator. The elevator will take the player up to the main lobby area adjacent to the playing area. On Historic Nature Trail (formerly Airport Road), a ramp is located by the stairs. For those unable to manage an escalator which leads down to the playing area, there is also an elevator inside to the left after you enter the building.

Zero Tolerance Policy

To establish an atmosphere which promotes the enjoyment of bridge as both a competitive and social game, the MABC has adopted the ACBL's policy of courteous behavior. For tournaments to be fun, cooperation from all (players, organizers, staff, and volunteers) is necessary.

Please report conduct that is unacceptable by calling the director immediately, keeping in mind that we must be tolerant of other people in general and bridge players in particular. Also, please report especially outstanding or refreshing conduct on a player memo form (available from any director or on the information table).

Commendable

- Being a good "host" or "guest" at the table
- Greeting others in a friendly manner
- Praising the bidding and/or play of the opponents

Unacceptable

- Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats, or violence
- Negative comments concerning opponent's or partner's play or bidding
- Gloating over good results
- Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table
- Loud/disruptive arguing with a tournament director
- Ringing cell phones or pagers
- Continuing slow play

All About

Knockouts

When a new Knockout starts this week, there will be, at times, upwards of 600 teams buying entries. In order for us to get the event started smoothly, please follow these steps:

1. Know your masterpoints.

All knockout events this week are **bracketed**, which means that we need to know the **TOTAL** number of masterpoints of **EVERYONE** on your team in order to assign you to the correct bracket. Use the masterpoint total provided in your last **ACBL Bulletin** to figure your points. If you're not sure, there is a look-up computer outside the director's office in Hall 3 for that purpose. You will need to fill out a bracketing slip prior to buying an entry. They're available at the selling station. It asks for your total masterpoints, a Captain's name, and the number of people on your team. Fill this out completely, come back to the selling station with this slip and \$40 for the team, and swap it for an entry. A note: non-ACBL members will be charged an extra \$2.00 per session. Please mention this when you buy your entry.

2. Assign a Captain

In order to facilitate the bracketing once the event begins, pick **ONE PERSON** on your team to buy the entry. When one player buys a second entry for a team because he/she is not sure if someone bought one, and then has to turn that entry back in, it slows the process down.

3. Find a seat

Once you have bought your entry, have everyone on your team find a seat at an empty table on the floor, **away from the selling area**. Leave room for others to buy their entry. Once team assignments commence, have **one person** come up to the selling area to learn where your team is to start. Space is at a premium, and fewer people around the assignment area means people can learn their assignment more quickly.

4. Expedite the process

When you get your assignment, go to your table and fill out your entry completely. Make sure the **name** and **player number** of **everyone** on the team is on the entry, and legible. If someone on your team is not a member of the ACBL, have them fill out the address portion of the entry.

5. Where are you?

Before the caddies come by to pick up your entry, please write your table assignment somewhere on the entry. This will expedite the process of getting the bracket sheets on the wall. When you are done, leave the entry **on the table, visible**, so the caddy can pick it up without disrupting play.

Where To Buy

Knockout Entries

In order to handle the large number of teams wanting to buy entries for the knockouts that start **Monday night** and at **1:00 each afternoon**, there are two selling stations.

Which station you will use will depend on how many masterpoints you turn in as your team total.

If your team averages over 750 points per player (i.e. you turn in over 3000 MPs for a 4-person team), you will buy your entry at the traditional selling station in Hall 2.

If your team averages less than 750 points per player, you will buy your entry at the selling station in Hall 1.

If you're still not sure where to buy your entry, ask any director. They're here to help.

See the map on pages 6 and 7 for detailed locations.

Note: These instructions are for the Knockouts starting at 1:00 and the Monday night KO only. All other KOs, plus the midnight games, will be sold at the Knockout station in Hall 2.

Trolley Service

The trolleys run 8 a.m. through midnight daily. For information and routes, check the kiosk at the Parkway entrance.

Parking

There is a city-owned lot about a block away from the convention center on the Historic Nature Trail. The rate is \$3 per day during the week and \$5 on weekends. No in/out privileged.

Handicap Parking

There are a limited number of parking spots on Airport Road. You must have a permit or tag otherwise you will be towed.

Warning: do not park in the loading dock area or in motel lots unless you are a guest.

Information and Registration

The Information and Registration Desks are located near the Parkway entrance in the lower gallery. They are open Monday from 6:30-7:15, Tuesday through Saturday from 11:30 a.m. - 12:45 p.m., and from 6:30 - 7:15 p.m. **The Desks close 15 minutes before the afternoon and evening sessions begin so that volunteers can play. Please register only once.**

Smoking Policy

No smoking is permitted in the Convention Center. You may smoke outside at the Airport and Parkway entrances. Please use provided receptacles. Hospitality breaks will be provided.

Prize Desk

There are First Overall Awards and Section Tops for all regionally rated events and Early Bird and Midnight games. Prizes will be awarded from results posted in the Daily Bulletin, so none will be given out until the day following the event. The only exception will be awards for the Sunday events.

No prizes will be mailed. The prize room is located in Room 12, next to the escalator in the gallery across from Great Hall 1 on the lower level. The Prize Room will be open one hour prior to the afternoon and evening sessions Wednesday through Saturday, and from 9 to 2 on Sunday. On Friday and Saturday night, it will be open 1/2 hour after the evening session. It will close promptly 15 minutes prior to the sessions to allow our volunteers to get to their games.

You can help us greatly if you can tell us the day, session and type of event, the section letter and direction of your section top. No prize can be awarded until the directors have officially certified the results.

Daily Bulletins

Bulletins will be available at both entrances of the convention center and in front of each director office beginning Wednesday morning. Please put the names of new Life Masters, interesting stories, bridge hands, etc. in the bulletin box located at the Parkway entrance of the Convention Center.

Photographer

Winners! I/N winners will be photographed in the playing area immediately following the game. New Life Masters and First Time Regional Event Winners may have their pictures taken in Room 12.

Players with Non-ACBL Masterpoints

Players with non-ACBL masterpoints must inform the director before entering any Flighted, Stratified, or Bracketed event. Failure to do so may result in disqualifications and loss of any MP's won.

What's The Point(s)?

How Do I Get My Gold?

There will be lots of opportunities for you to earn gold points this week, both in pair events and in knockouts, but there is one constant to them all: **you have to play in an event that last two sessions or longer to earn gold points, and must have an upper limit of at least 750 masterpoints.** Let's see how you do it:

Knockouts

Winning gold in knockouts is easy. Just win your first two matches! All knockouts consist of four matches. If you win your first match and get knocked out in your second match, your points will be red. The amount of gold points awarded will depend on the average masterpoint holding of your team. Teams averaging 750 points per player or more will receive 100% gold. Those teams averaging less will earn 1/3 - 1/5 gold, depending. All knockout winners, however, are guaranteed to win at least six points.

Open Pairs

Open Pairs are a two-session event, and you must play both sessions. When you buy your entry in the afternoon, you commit to play (i.e. you pay for) the evening session at the same time.

Gold points will be awarded for finishing overall (the combination of your afternoon and evening scores) in Flights A and B, and for winning a section top in either session. There are no masterpoint restrictions to play in the Open Pairs.

750/300 Pairs

The same conditions apply as the Open Pairs, with the exception that you must finish in the Overalls in the top strat (0-750) to win gold points. The good thing about this event is that no one in the field will have over 750 masterpoints. There is a 750/300 2-session pair event every day, Tuesday through Saturday, starting at 1:00 in Hall 1.

Side Game Series

The Side Game Series are single session events for those who want to play, say, once a day. There are no masterpoint restrictions. There are two ways to win gold: finish first in your section (first N/S or E/W) - play a second session in that Series to convert those points to gold. Or, finish in the overalls in for the entire series. No matter how many times you play, we will average your two best games for overall consideration. There are four Side Game Series this week, including one that plays each morning at 9:00. Check the schedule for details.

Lost & Found

Valuable items like watches, jewelry, wallets, purses and the like, if found by a tournament staffer, will be turned in to the Prize Room (room 12) for safe-keeping.

Other items, such as convention cards, coats, mugs, etc. will generally be left on the table, as that is the likely place that the people who lost them will look first.

Looking

There is a big message board at the Parkway Entrance to the Convention Center. It's a good place to leave a note if you're trying to hook up with another player, or wanting to share a ride to the airport.

Immediately behind the message board is the Partnership Desk.

Try to get there an hour or so before each session to give the volunteers time to find you the perfect partner.

It will close 15 minutes before game time.

Love Kitchen To Benefit From Monday Night Charity Pairs

The pair events being held Monday evening, both the open and the 299er, are charity games benefitting the Love Kitchen of Knoxville, Tennessee.

The Love Kitchen is a community facility located in East Knoxville. It is run and operated by 85 year old twin sisters, Helen Ashe and Ellen Turner. For 21 years, they have been feeding the homeless, the homebound and young poor families in the area. Those who can get to the Love Kitchen are fed breakfast on Wednesdays and lunch on Thursdays. The families sign up for groceries on Wednesday mornings and pick them up Wednesday afternoons.

Also, on Thursdays about 2,000 meals (enough for the week or as a supplement to other programs) are boxed up to deliver to the shut-ins. On the second floor of the building is a library and "homeology" kitchen used for teaching food preparation to the youth of East Knoxville. Clothing and homewares are kept for the needy. Over 100 volunteers from the University and local churches prepare and deliver the meals weekly. Donations go directly to food production and office expenses.

The love and faith that the sisters put into the kitchen is contagious and brings back cooks, servers, drivers and packers every week for that big bear hug that the sisters deliver. 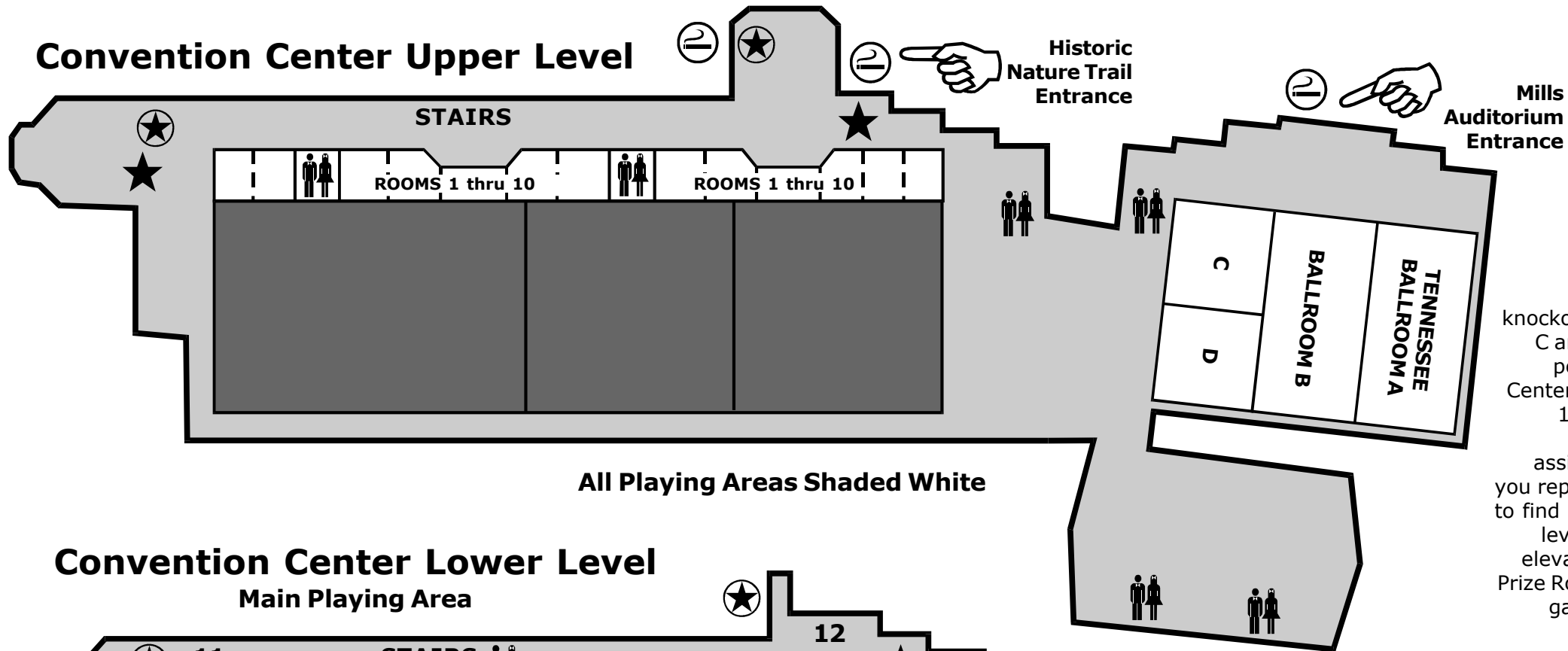

Convention Center Upper Level



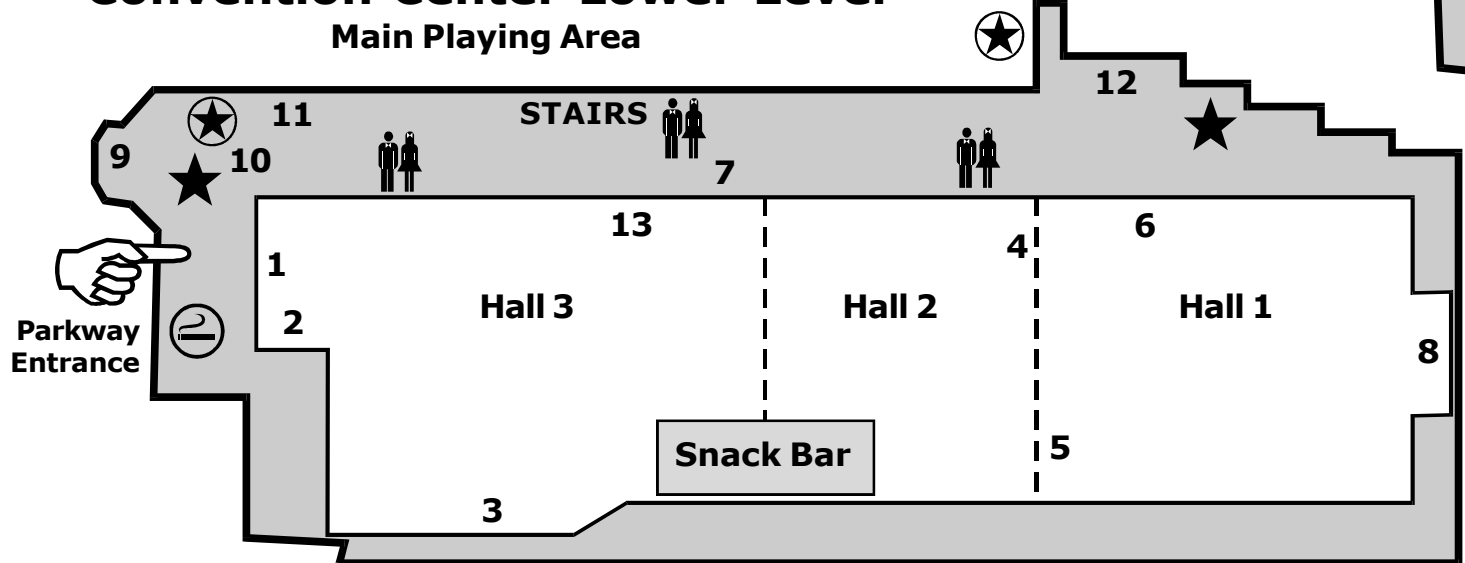
